Performance Bond:

The Performance Bond for each team participating at the Senior Provincial Championships is \$500. Bond money is returned if there are no infractions at the event at the F.B.A.O. A.G.M. Meeting. All participants **MUST** follow Appendix G – Code of Conduct; and be aware of the ramifications of B7.6.5 which reads: “Each team competing at Provincial Championships will post a Bond that may be forfeited to the F.B.A.O. as a result of inappropriate actions by the team and/or its players/officials. Those team(s) and/or its players/officials that cause damage to event facilities and/or accommodations for the event: (a) will forfeit their Bond, and be responsible to collectively pay all damages and/or loss revenues due to their actions; (b) will pay an additional \$500 Team Fine or \$100 Fine per team member whom caused damages and/or loss of revenues; and (c) suspensions may be issued to those responsible, such that the suspensions continue into the next playing season.”

Contract Verification:

1. All players’ names must be on the Team Roster sheet. All players must register with the F.B.A.O. prior to playing their first game; and this registration will take place at the arena where their first game is being played. All players and team officials must have

picture ID and or two (2) pieces of ID, with **no exceptions**. Their player/team registration sheets must be available as well.

2. Teams are allowed five (5) pick-ups for the Senior Provincial Championships. All names of Pick-Up players and/or team officials, along with their preferred team name must be on the team's roster sheet. All pick-ups must produce a completed pick-up contract in order to register with the F.B.A.O. prior to playing their first game. A copy of their preferred player/team registration sheet must be available as well.
3. Please note: it is the responsibility of the team officials of each team to ensure the following with regard to player registration: (a) each player has signed on an F.B.A.O. registration form; and (b) all registered junior-aged players that are participating must provide their completed F.B.A.O. waiver form that has been signed by a parent or guardian, and signed by their preferred team official and participating team official.

Coaching Certification:

B7.4.14 All teams participating at the Senior Provincial Championships must have a qualified coach/team official who has attended and completed an N.C.C.P. Level 1 or Part of Module A or Community Coach Initiation (BF2) Theory Coaching Clinic minimum. (May 1995) (April 2015) If a team does not have a signed qualified team official for a game, a \$100.00 (April 2015) fine will be levied. (October 1998)

Each Elite team must have a team official who has completed the following N.C.C.P. coaching clinic by the year stipulated:

Current – Broomball to Compete Certified minimum (UPDATED – April 2016)

This person must be registered with the team at the beginning of the event and must participate with the team throughout the event. (October 1998) Teams are allowed to pick up certified coach/team official for the provincials. This person being picked up must already be signed as a team official. The person fulfilling the role of certified team official may also be a player, provided the person is also registered as a team official on the team, except for Juvenile and Elite teams. (October 2000) The person participating in the event who holds the N.C.C.P. certification must provide proof of this certification prior to the event and must be prepared to show this documentation upon registration at the beginning of the event.

Anyone who has N.C.C.P. certification signing as a team official put their N.C.C.P. number beside their registration form signature. (October 1995)

Teams failing to comply with these stated criteria will not be permitted to participate in the event. (May 1996)

Medals and All-Star Award Presentations:

At the Senior Provincials the medal presentations to the Gold, Silver, and Bronze medal winning teams will take place immediately following the completion of the medal games, as determined by the Host Committee. All-Star Awards for the First and Second Teams will also be presented following the championship games as determined by the Host Committee.

Schedule/Championship Guidelines:

The posted schedule at the event is the Official Schedule. The schedule will be distributed to Regions and posted on the F.B.A.O. website (www.ontariobroomball.ca), upon completion of the draw and Regional Championships.

Canadian Broomball Federation rules are in effect for the tournament, unless they are modified in Article B8 – CBF Rulebook in the F.B.A.O. By-Laws. Please note the following rule modifications:

1. All games will consist of two (2) fifteen minute stop time periods. Refer to B8.3.2.
2. All game sheets to be verified by coaches prior to each game. Refer to B8.4.1.
3. For the F.B.A.O. Senior Provincial Championships, the following Overtime Ruling (B8.4.2) shall be utilized instead of Article 49 of the C.B.F. Rulebook:
 - a. For the Elite Divisions the following Overtime procedure will be utilized. The new sudden-death C.B.F. Overtime will be in effect, however, with a maximum of one (1) 15 minute stop time period, playing with a goalie and three (3) other players. If no goals are scored after the 15 minute sudden death period; then overtime with 15 minute stop time periods will revert to sudden death with 4 on 4 and no goalie as per the 2005-2007 C.B.F. Rulebook.
 - b. For all other divisions, except Elite divisions, the following overtime procedure will be utilized. The new sudden death C.B.F. overtime will be in effect, however, with a five (5) minute stop time period, playing with a goalie and three (3) other players. If no goals are scored after the five (5) minute sudden death period;

then overtime with fifteen (15) minute stop time periods will revert to sudden death with four (4) on (4) and no goalie as per the 2005-2007 C.B.F. Rulebook.

4. With regard to the schedule, teams must note that scheduled game times will be moved up in a situation where if necessary games are not required.
5. All registered junior-aged players must wear a full facial mask, C.S.A. approved. All junior players must also wear padded gloves effective for the 2014-2015 season. Gloves must have equal to or greater than the padding contained in commercially produced broomball gloves, and contain no external hard plastic. Major officials will have the final decision as to whether an illegal equipment penalty will be applied.
6. We recommend that players graduating from the junior level or new players to the game wear a C.S.A. approved half mask, at the least, at the senior level; with full implementation for all divisions by September 2016. (B8.4.5)
7. At the conclusion of all Regional Championship, Juvenile National Qualifier, Junior Provincial, and Senior Provincial games; all players will return to their own player's bench immediately after the game. Those team members that are not on the ice at the conclusion of play must remain on the bench until granted permission by the Major Officials to go onto the ice.

Teams will be instructed before the game, by the Major Official that they are to return to and stay on the bench after all games are concluded. This action is due to a number of altercations that have happened at the end of the games at past events.

The customary team celebration and congratulations will occur on the bench or after the Major Official has blown their whistle and gave a hand signal to allow the teams to exit the benches and shake hands with the opposing team. This will not take place until the Major Officials are satisfied that it safe to do so.

Team officials will be responsible to keep their players on the bench, until they are directed to go onto the ice. Failure to comply with this policy can result in the loss of the team's Performance Bond, or possible disciplinary action through a suspension.

8. Due to the lack of dressing rooms, the Province cannot accommodate separate rooms for male and female players on Co-Ed teams. Coaches should take appropriate steps as they see necessary.
