Driving Directions

Cornwall is located on the north bank of the St. Lawrence River at the intersection of Hwy-401 and Rt-128, approx. 100 km southeast of Ottawa, approx. 110 km southwest of Montreal and approx. 425 km northeast of Toronto. The arena is located between Seventh Street and Second Street, just west of Brookdale Avenue.

From Ottawa: Hwy-417 east approx. 59 km to Hwy-138 (exit 58). Proceed south on Hwy-138 approx. 34 km to Cornwall Centre Road. Turn right on Cornwall Centre Rd. and proceed west approx. 0.75 km to Brookdale Avenue. Turn left on Brookdale Ave. (still Hwy-138) and proceed south approx. 4.5 km to roundabout (traffic circle). Enter the roundabout and take the first exit onto 7th St. West. Proceed west on 7th St. approx. 0.5 km to arena on the left.

From Toronto: Hwy-401 east approx. 412 km to Hwy-138/Brookdale Ave. (exit 789). Turn right on Brookdale Ave. (Hwy-138) and proceed south approx. 3.5 km to roundabout (traffic circle). Enter the roundabout and take the first exit onto 7th St. West. Proceed west on 7th St. approx. 0.5 km to arena on the left.

Entry Requirements

Entry Deadline:

- The entry fee of **\$400 per team** must be submitted by **December 15th, 2015**.

Performance Bond:

- **\$500 per team**
 - All performance bonds due: **December 15th, 2015** (with tournament entry fee).
- Please refer to the **F.B.A.O. Senior Provincial Code of Conduct Contract** for additional violations that could lead to the loss of a team’s performance bond. Each team must have a team official prepared to sign for and uphold the standards outlined in this document prior to each team’s first game.

Team Information Sheet and Roster Completion

Information Sheet:

- On the information sheet, please include all of the following details:
 - Team Name
 - Region
 - Category
 - Sweater Colours
 - Team Contacts' Information
 - Please also list contact names and cell phone numbers for two people who will be available at the event (bottom of the page) – in case of emergency or required communication.

Roster:

- On the roster sheet, please include all of the following details:
 - Each team member's name (players and coaches)
 - Player's birth date
 - Player's sweater number
 - Designated captains and goaltenders
 - Valid N.C.C.P. coaching certificate number for coach(es) holding appropriate certification for the event (see Coaching Certification section)
- "All teams affiliated with the F.B.A.O. will be allowed to sign a maximum of **twenty (20) players**, preferred or common, and **four (4) team officials**" (B3.1.1).

Note:

- It is the responsibility of the team officials on each team to ensure the following:
 - Each player has signed an F.B.A.O. Team/Player Registration Form
 - Each player is playing in an age category in which they are permitted to play.
 - Where necessary, a player/team official is prepared to submit the necessary F.B.A.O. waiver form(s) and/or pick-up contracts.
 - The waiver forms must be signed by a parent or guardian and are to be completed when the participant is playing on a team in a higher category, or when a player is on a team from the opposite sex. (B2.2.7)
 - **All rosters are verified prior to the tournament to ensure the validity of the information provided.**

Participation Requirements

F.B.A.O. Registration:

- A participant in the Senior Provincials and/or Regionals, and Junior Provincials and/or National Qualifier, must have one of the two of the following qualifications as a prerequisite in playing:
 1. The player must be signed and be actively participating in an Ontario Broomball program recognized by the F.B.A.O. and as approved by the respective Regional Executive.
 2. The player must be a permanent resident of the Province of Ontario.

(B4.2.10)

Prior to First Game:

- All players/team officials must register **prior** to playing their first game. All players/team officials' names must be on the roster sheet and game sheet, but they can register at anytime during the tournament. **Registration will occur at the arena where their first game is played** (Registration sheets will be moved according to the schedule after this point). **Give yourself enough time to register!**
 - All players and team officials must have a picture ID that includes their full name and birthday; otherwise they require 2 pieces of ID to prove their identity. **No exceptions!**
 - Coaches in all divisions need to provide a picture ID and N.C.C.P. card for verification.
 - Team registration sheets must be available as well.
 - For the Senior Provincials, **five (5) pick-ups are allowed.** (B7.4.7 – B7.4.10)
 - Guidelines for pick-up players/team officials are the same as those for regular tournament play; however pick-ups must be from within the team's category of play or below.
 - Pick-up players/team officials must be from the same region as the team picking them up.
 - All names of pick-up players/team officials along with their preferred team must be included on the team roster.
 - Pick-ups must present completed Official F.B.A.O. carbon-copied pick-up contracts (photocopies are not allowed) in order to register prior to playing their first game.
 - A copy of their preferred team's registration sheet must be available as well.
 - "A minimum of 11 registered **[signed in]** players must be present at the beginning of the event, after this the team must have 6 players in order to be recognized as a team in the competitive event at the Championship" (CBF Rulebook – Article 45 B).

Coaching Certification

Intermediate, Masters, and Co-Ed Coaching Requirements:

- All team participating in the Intermediate, Masters, and Co-Ed categories are required to have the following C.B.F. coaching requirements:
 - A C.B.F. certified coach on the bench who has completed an N.C.C.P. Level 1 or Part of Module A or Community Coach Initiation (BF2) Theory Coaching Clinic minimum. (B7.4.14)

Elite Team Coaching Requirements:

- All teams participating in the Elite category are required to have the following C.B.F. coaching requirements:
 - A C.B.F. certified coach on the bench who has a complete C.B.F. Level 2 Certificate (N.C.C.P. Level 1&2 Theory, Technical, and Practical complete) or Broomball to Compete Certified (B.T.C.) minimum. (B7.4.14)

Requirements for Coaches in all Categories:

- This person must be registered with the team at the beginning of the event and must be participating with the team throughout the event. Teams are allowed to pick up a certified coach/team official for the provincials. This person being picked up must already be signed as a team official.
- The person participating in the event who holds the N.C.C.P. certification must provide proof of this certification prior to the event and must be prepared to show this documentation upon registration at the beginning of the event.
- For senior teams, individuals may only be signed with one men's team as either a coach, manager or trainer within each of the Elite, Intermediate, Young Masters, Masters and Recreation Divisions, provided these teams are in different leagues. Similarly, an individual may only be signed with one ladies team in any of the above noted capacities. An individual may also be signed as a team official with a Co-Ed team in addition to the above. (B3.2.1)

Consequences for Team without a Certified Coach:

- If a team does not have a signed qualified team official for any portion of a game, a **\$100.00 fine** will be levied for each game in question.

Tournament Draw & Schedule

- The tournament draw is approved by the Regional Representatives.
 - The draw of opponents will be made randomly and in accordance with B7.4.11.
 - The posted schedule at the event is considered the Official Schedule.
 - The schedule will be distributed to the Regional Representatives and posted on the F.B.A.O. website (www.ontariobroomball.ca) upon completion of the tournament draw and Regional Championships.

Tournament Rules

Game Rules:

- Canadian Broomball Federation (C.B.F.) rules are in effect for the tournament. Please note the following rule amendments:
 - All teams must be ready to begin play one hour prior to their scheduled game time.
 - All game sheets must be verified by coaches prior to each game (B8.4.1).
 - Warm Up: only three minutes
 - Games: consist of two (2) fifteen minute stop time periods. (B8.3.2)
 - C.B.F. rules apply for straight time and mercy
 - Overtime: For the F.B.A.O. Senior Provincial Championships, the following overtime ruling shall be utilized instead of Article 49 of the C.B.F. Rulebook: (B8.4.2)
 - For the Elite Divisions: The new sudden death C.B.F. overtime will be in effect, however, with a maximum of one fifteen (15) minute stop time period, playing with a goalie and three (3) other players. If no goals are scored after the fifteen (15) minute sudden death period; then overtime with fifteen (15) minute stop time periods will revert to sudden death with four (4) on four (4) and no goalie as per the 2005-2007 C.B.F. Rulebook.
 - For all other divisions, except Elite: The new sudden death C.B.F. overtime will be in effect, however, with a five (5) minute stop time period, playing with a goalie and three (3) other players. If no goals are scored after the five (5) minute sudden death period; then overtime with fifteen (15) minute stop time periods will revert to sudden death with four (4) on (4) and no goalie as per the 2005-2007 C.B.F. Rulebook.
 - At the conclusion of all Regional Championship, Juvenile Qualifier, Junior Provincial, and Senior Provincial games; all players will return to their own player's bench immediately after the game. Those team members that are not on the ice at the conclusion of play must remain on the bench until granted permission by the Major Officials to go onto the ice (B8.4.7).
 - Teams will shake hands after the game.
 - With regard to the schedule, teams must note that schedule game times will be moved up in a situation where if necessary games are not required.

Additional Rules to Note:

- B8.3.8: All registered junior aged players must wear full facial mask (C.S.A. approved) at all Junior and Senior Events within the Province of Ontario, including Regionals, league play, and tournaments.
- **B8.4.6: All junior players must wear padded gloves effective for the 2014-2015 season. Gloves must have equal to or greater than the padding contained in commercially produced broomball gloves, and contain no external hard plastic. Major officials will have the final decision as to whether an illegal equipment penalty will be applied.**

Note:

- Due to the lack of dressing rooms, the Province cannot accommodate separate rooms for male and female players on Co-Ed teams. Coaches should take appropriate steps as they see necessary.

Medals and All-Star Award Presentations

- At the Senior Provincials the medal presentations to the Gold, Silver, and Bronze medal winning teams will take place immediately following the completion of the medal games, as determined by the Host Committee. All-Star Awards for the First and Second Teams will also be presented at that time.

- **Teams are to enforce zero alcohol/substance tolerance at this event.**
